The Detective Rob Miller Mysteries Follow DCI Rob Miller and his team as they investigate murders across London and beyond. Choose your book below to download the accompanying discussion guide.

Be warned! There are spoilers in the guides, so make sure you've finished reading the book first.

The West London Murders (Book 2)

- **Vigilante Justice vs. The Law:** Is the "Avenging Angel" killer a sympathetic figure given her background, or does her crusade against violent men cross an unforgivable line?
- **Digital Safe Spaces as Hunting Grounds:** How does the SAAFE forum—designed to protect sex workers—ironically become a tool used by both violent clients and the killer to track targets?
- **The Tragedy of Collateral Damage:** How does Dennis Patterson's accidental murder highlight the chaotic, unpredictable dangers of vigilante retribution?
- **Undercover Operations and Ethics:** What are the ethical implications of Jo Maguire posing undercover at the Daring Divas escort agency to hack their database?

- **Subsect Networks in West London:** How does the murder of drug lord Aadam Yousef expose the overlapping layers of county lines drug operations in suburban London?

Discussion Guide

The West London Murders (Book 2) — Discussion Guide Answers

1. Vigilante Justice vs. The Law

- **The Killer's Motive:** The "Avenging Angel" (Mary) targets men who have physically or sexually assaulted sex workers or refused to pay them.
- **Crusade vs. Crime:** Driven by her own past trauma and anger over systemic failures to protect vulnerable women, she views her murders as necessary retribution. However, her vigilante crusade crosses the line into brutal execution and leads to the death of innocent collateral victims.

2. Digital Safe Spaces as Hunting Grounds

- **The Purpose of SAAFE:** The SAAFE website was built as an online community forum for sex workers to share warnings, phone numbers, and blacklists regarding violent or non-paying clients.
- **Weaponization:** The killer actively monitors the forum's "Warnings and Wasters" section, extracting the phone numbers and locations of blacklisted men to track them down.

3. The Tragedy of Collateral Damage

- **The Mistaken Target:** Dennis Patterson, an innocent dental equipment sales representative visiting from Harrogate, has no connection to sex work or violence.
- **The Fatal Mix-Up:** He is murdered simply because he is staying at the Pear Tree Hotel in room 11, right next door to a violent client named "Lewis" who had booked an escort and was the actual intended target.

4. Undercover Operations and Ethics

- **The Undercover Ruse:** DCI Jo Maguire poses as a new applicant named "Mary" at the Daring Divas escort agency, taking staged glamour photos to establish credibility.
- **Procedural and Ethical Issues:** To bypass formal warrants and secrecy rules, Jo uses a staged delivery distraction to access the receptionist's computer and copy the agency's client database, walking a fine line on privacy and evidence admissibility.

5. Subsect Networks in West London

- **The Dual Life of Aadam Yousef:** The murder of Yousef in his Hounslow home exposes how his respectable suburban lifestyle and new BMW were funded by Class A drug trafficking.
- **County Lines Integration:** The investigation brings in Jo Maguire and the National Crime Agency (NCA), revealing how London hubs supply county lines drug networks reaching into regional towns across the UK.
